The Mission of the Grand Traverse County Resource Recovery Department (RecycleSmart) is to protect the public health and environment of our community by efficiently managing waste materials with a focus on resource conservation.

RecycleSmart provides recycling opportunities & education to residents & businesses within Grand Traverse County. Staff includes two (2) full time employees and one (1) part time seasonal brush site attendant. Staff coordinates special waste collections, participates in local community events, supports the recycling activities of local businesses while linking the public to available recycling options, operates the Keystone Brush Drop-Off Site and administers the County's Solid Waste Management Plan. 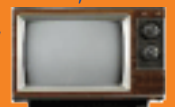

CHRISTMAS TREE DROP-OFF

DECEMBER 26 - JANUARY 18

The Traverse City Parks and Recreation Department will be accepting Christmas trees from City residents for recycling. The Parks crew will chip and recycle trees as mulch for use on nature trails. Just bring your trees to Hull Park, located at 660 Hannah Avenue, behind the Traverse Area District Library and at the end of Hannah Street. Follow the Christmas tree drop-off signs.

Drop off trees between 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. beginning Friday, December 26, 2014, through Sunday, January 18, 2015.

Please do not leave your Christmas trees in alleys or on streets. The City will NOT be collecting them.
